Mrs CADDEYS FIELD

meeting with Virginia Water Football Club (VWFC) representatives at Manorcrofts School on 26th April proved to be one of the largest & angriest resident gatherings of recent years, with vehement opposition expressed to VWFC's plans for Mrs Caddeys Field (MCF). After the meeting Paul Turrell, RBC CEO, advised that they recommending that VWFC now "look at potential alternative sites" & other RBC Councillors have commented that the MCF "idea" is no longer an option for VWFC's proposed move.



The situation was formally reviewed at the RBC Community Services Committee meeting on 16 $^{
m th}$ June, with RBC Officers recommending that RBC :

i) discontinue discussions with VWFC for the use of MCF as a sports hub; &

ii) continue the current arrangements for the operation of the Egham Royal Show on MCF

These recommendations were approved unanimously. Many thanks for the efforts of local residents in stopping this loss of a valued Green Belt site - shows that resident power can triumph.....

RBC ELECTION RESULT

missed it, the result for the Egham Town Ward in the RBC election on 5th May was :

- (Independent) (Conservative) (Labour)
- (62% of vote) 769 279 187 1.235 Turnout = 29.2%

Following his successful re-election, on a lower turnout than usual, David commented : " In May I was returned as one of your Egham Councillors with a significant majority, a result for which I am both honoured and proud. My lasting memory of the election, not only was the excellent weather on the day, but how many people who both helped in this success and reinforced my conviction that party politics has no place in local elections. In the next four years I will continue to represent Egham Residents in keeping Egham a town we can be proud to live, work and call our community".

MAYOR MAKING

On 18th May Cllr Alan Alderson, one of your Egham Town Councillors, was appointed as the Mayor of Runnymede for 2016/7. Alan has represented Egham Town for 14 years & is the first Independent Mayor of Runnymede since Cllr Linda Gillham (representing Thorpe) in 2012/3. As Mayor, Alan has decided to raise funds for Woking & Sam Beare Hospices, Home-start Runnymede and Woking & Dementia Carers Support in Runnymede and he



aims to raise awareness of these charities throughout his one year term.

MAGNA CARTA DAY (11th June)

The weather for MC801 was cloudy/showery but the turnout was good as was the number of stalls (70). Full use was made of the 3 performance areas (outside the Lit, outside Tescos & in Station Road North) by a range of bands & entertainers. The ERA stall was a success raising over £100 & increasing membership - many thanks to those that helped man the stall during the day.

Magna Carta Day is organised by a small group of volunteers representing the Chamber of Commerce & Egham Residents' Association, including our very own Cynthia Reilly. They would like to thank everyone who supported the programme and look forward to another successful event in 2017.





HIGH STREET ENTRY GATES/BOLLARDS

Latest advice from SCC is that they are still considering the best method of improving the gate situation on the High Street &, as a cheaper & quicker alternative to sunken bollards, are considering installing magnetic locks on the gates? This would avoid having to dig up the road, & check on the sub-surface near the entrance. Timing for installation remains uncertain, with "this summer" still being mentioned. We continue to press SCC/RBC to move quicker on this

issue (given that it is over a year since the consultation exercise approved an increase in gate security).

EGHAM GATEWAY DEVELOPMENT (Station Road North & Leisure Centre)

RBC have advised that the procurement process is progressing very well and that a contractor shortlist for the project has been established. Bid submissions are now due in September, with the decision on who to appoint at the end of October. Public consultation on the proposals will then follow ahead of construction, whose schedule remains as commencement of work in Spring 2017 with completion by July 2019.





GRAVEL EXTRACTION

Unsurprisingly, SCC have delayed further their Planning & Regulatory Committee's review of Hansons application for gravel extraction at Milton Park Farm until **7th September**, probably again "at the earliest". No reason for the delay from the

13th July has been given (although this is now 7.5yrs since the application was lodged)!

AIRPORT CAPACITY

In advance of a government decision on the site of additional airport capacity in the South East, both Heathrow & Gatwick have recently made proposals to convince the government to select them. The former's submission promised to broadly meet the Davies



Commission's recommendations in full, including a ban on night flights. Gatwick then responded by claiming that they could offer an "accelerated timetable" for the project, with a new runway becoming operational by 2025 (thus offering a faster, cheaper & cleaner option)?

A decision is due "this summer" but a "Whitehall logjam", coupled with the shambolic fallout from the EU Referendum & the Chilcot Report due in July, is likely to push such a major decision back to the autumn?? Indeed, given the likely PM candidates, the Evening Standard is calling Heathrow as "dead in the water"!
